This week's spotlight - How do we manage behaviour at Dilton Marsh?

Every adult in school is responsible for children's behaviour at Dilton Marsh. This means that we all share the same high expectations of the children and follow the school policy for both rewards and sanctions.

Good behaviour is something that is taught to the children and we do have a curriculum where we regularly re-visit our routines and rules so they are embedded.

Behaviour is best managed through the positive so staff will try to 'catch' the good behaviour where ever possible. This often impacts on other children around who also want to be noticed. Rewards can include verbal praise, stickers, Class Dojos or a head teacher's award.

When a child is not following the school rules they will always receive a warning first. This is a request to stop and make a better choice. If they do not choose to change the behaviour they will receive time out at play time. This can be either 5 or 10 minutes. Parents won't always be told of this unless there are several incidents in a week. At this point we will call you to discuss how we can all support good behaviour. Some behaviours may need intervention from another teacher or a member of the Senior leadership Team. You will be made aware of these. The table below demonstrates how we code different behaviours so that we can identify patterns through the school. We do have some children who may need a more individualised approach to behaviour to support them. This will be written in consultation with the parent.
