Dear parents

I am always proud of the children at Dilton Marsh Primary School but this week I was particularly proud when Mr Phillips from Matravers met with the year 6 children who are transferring in September. He met each child individually asking them about their strengths and what they might need help with. He asked what they were worried about when they moved up. Listening in to their comments was fascinating and their responses were so mature. When Mr Phillips left he was so complementary about them all. What a great accolade to them! Next week we are really looking forward to taking them on their residential visit to the New Forest where they will be climbing, creating camps and other outdoor activities.

This week has been a quiet one. Our year 4 have completed their Multiplication Tables Check which Mrs Bown has talked about in the Spotlight below and they all tried their very hardest. Next week we will be completing the Phonics Screening for year 1 and some of Year 2.

As some of you will be aware, we are waiting each week for the phone call from Ofsted. It is now 3 and a half years since they inspected us and they were due to return after 2 years. They will phone us to let us know in the morning of the day before they arrive and then will be on site for 2 days to complete the inspection. Once we have the phone call we will inform you the same day and ask you to complete the parent view on the Ofsted site. They will take your responses into consideration and ask for evidence about any patterns which emerge.



This weeks spotlight - Multiplication at Dilton Marsh school

Multiplication is one of the fundamental key areas within calculation that we teach the children. Much of the key learning of multiplication tables happens across Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4. However this is not to say that we don't start thinking about multiplication until a child gets to Year 2. In Year 1 the children begin to count in multiples of twos, fives and tens, this setting the basis for what they learn in Year 2. It is also not to say that by the time we get to Year 4 and the children take the multiplication table check (MTC) in June that we then stop thinking and learning about multiplication tables. This is not the case; regular daily practice still happens in Year 5 and then in Year 6 the key is fluency and recall. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12x12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help you to identify if your child may need additional support.

It is fair to say that children who know their multiplication tables up to 12 x 12 (with a good amount of understanding as well as recall) cope better with the demands of the maths curriculum in many areas, such as formal written division, equivalent fractions, percentages and ratio and proportion.

One of the ways we support our children with learning their multiplication tables, is to use TT Rockstars in and out of school from Year 2 upwards. In term 5 we introduced a weekly celebration to enthuse the children in using TT Rockstars at home. Each week certificates are given out the children and their names also appear on the newsletter so they are celebrated across the school.
