
I was certain from my first impressions, during my interview and subsequent visits, that Dilton was the perfect choice for me as Headteacher and since starting my post this week I have been tremendously impressed by the whole school, especially the children. Every time I step onto the playground I am welcomed by a sea of inquisitive smiley faces, each keen to learn and proud of their school.

As I am certain you are all aware, Dilton has some real strengths. The practice across the school is getting better and better and results are starting to show that. In Early Years Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 they achieve as well as or if not better than children in other schools. As you will be aware a key area of focus for the school has been to improve our Year 6 results, after three years of them not being where we would like them to be. This work has started, and will continue to develop, and is really bearing fruit in Key Stage Two.

I feel it is really important to assure parents/carers that I recognise work needs to be done quickly to improve the outcomes for all our children. This work has already been started by Miss Ronxin and the staff over the last year, and I look forward to working with Mr. Burr and Acorn to continue this work.

I believe Dilton is a school of huge potential and I am determined to secure a great future for the school. I have the very highest expectations of the staff and all the children and it is my intention, by working together, that we can make our school the best it can possibly be.

To close, I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the numerous parents/carers who have made me feel so welcome as the Headteacher of Dilton, your well-wishes and positive comments have been greatly appreciated. I am looking forward to working closely with you in the future.



Attendance in Term Two

After a busy and exciting term it is good to look back and reflect.

At the end of term one our attendance data was looking strong but there was still room for improvement and it is good to see that in term two there was an improvement in attendance in all classes.

The overall attainment for the school was 97%, which is good but now needs to be maintained or improved on. We also have 107 children who have an attendance of 98% or above which is wonderful.

Across the school 140 children have now earnt their badges for 1 term's 100% attendance, well done to all of you and please keep up the good work, the more you are in school, the more you will learn and discover. At the end of this term there will be awards for children who have an attendance of 98% or above.

I look forward to giving out lots of certificates at the end of term 3.


Christmas Card recycling
