

This week's Spotlight - Internet Safety

Safer Internet Day 2024 is celebrated on 6th February 2024, with thousands of people across the UK working together to champion youth voice and engage in conversations about how we can all work together to make the internet a great and safe place.

Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity to focus on online safety with your child, whatever their age. This year's theme is all about change and influence online. Staying up to date with what children are doing online can feel like a challenge sometimes. However, you don't have to be an expert in every new app or service. Simply having conversations with your children about their lives online, and what to do if they need help or something goes wrong, is what's most important. Here are a few simple steps you can take to help bridge the gap:

- Talk little and often Have a regular open dialogue with your child. Find out their favourite apps, games and online friends.
- Stay proactive Following discussions, take time to research the platforms they are using. Check the age rating of the apps and games they are using but also look beyond this and check the content and privacy settings.
- Seek support Each app and game has its own safety guidelines and reporting features. Seek help for your child if you have a concern.

If you would like more information, NSPCC and the Safer Internet Centre have created a range of pages to help you talk about these issues and ideas with your child, no matter how much time you have and in an age-appropriate way.
